## PrintWest 2021 competition

Another club competition coming up folks! Please get your entries in to Jane (janef@exemail.com.au) by Sunday 13 June so that the committee can once again select the top 15 images in each category (mono and colour) to enter. If we have any images that make it to round 2, the club will cover the cost of printing.

Essential details are as follows but please read all the details at: https://wapf.org.au/index.php/competitions/printwest-2021

- There are 2 competitions, one for Monochromatic images the other for Colour images. There is no defined subject, the choice of subject is at the photographer's discretion.
- The acceptable date range for 2021 competition is 3 July 2019 to 2 July 2021.
- Digital entries:
- Files must contain full EXIF data so that the date of capture can be confirmed.
- Images to be sized no more than 1920 pixels wide AND no more than 1080 pixels high
- Maximum file size shall be 1.5 MB
- The colour space SHOULD be sRGB. NOTE: entries not in sRGB Colour space may be disadvantaged, as they will be judged in the sRGB colour space;
- The file format is to be JPEG.
- Label your entries according to the PrintWest competition name:
- Colour: c\_ClubCode\_FirstName Surname\_Image Title.jpg;
- Monochromatic: m\_ClubCode\_ FirstName Surname \_Image Title.jpg.
- Our club code is: FRE
- You can enter as many images as you like but they must comply to the above
- You must submit your images to me with the PrintWest competition name and to the correct sizing above (I do not have time to rename or resize your images so please pay attention!).

- **13 June 2021** entries due to Jane for judging
- 2 July 2021 (midnight) Closing date Club's digital entries no late entries accepted
- **30 July 2021** Clubs will be informed of acceptances for ROUND 2 (prints)

## Upcoming Education Night June

Our presenter for June will be Paul Curtis, from Far North Queensland. He has over 35 years of experience in photography. This will be a zoom night, but everyone is still welcome to attend the club on the night to hear Paul speak.

#### Below is a Bio on his journey.

#### Paul Curtis April 2021

Wilderness landscapes are Paul's passion and he moved himself to far north Queensland to 1984 to pursue his goal of having the best photo library in that part of the world. He was attracted to the countryside around Cairns which has everything from pristine, golden beaches devoid of footprints to permanently damp mountain tops with views over unspoiled wilderness, to dry sandstone escarpment country of deep gorges and caves - all within 2 hours drive of his home in Kuranda. Photography is his driving force and so for the last 35 years has been studiously visiting and revisiting the remotest corners of North Queensland towards that goal of having a photographic representation of North Queensland's wilderness that is second to none.

The results have been published in calendars and books and have illustrated a number of magazine articles on outdoors adventure and photography. As a consequence of those photographic travels the locally best selling "Traveller's Guide to North Queensland" was published in 1996 which also makes for a great photographer's companion. It is currently in its 5th edition with around 9,000 being sold. His latest publishing journey has seen the launch of the major publication "A Heritage of Trees", with words by Rupert Russell and additional photography by Steven Nowakowski and a number of others. Paul also runs a small personalised photo-tour business and photographic workshops. All his tours and books can be found on his website below along with a gallery of around 1,200 images.

# What is required to make a great Photograph?

From one of Pat's favourite photographers - Bruce Percy (2008)

I was just thinking today, that if someone asked me - what is required to make a great photograph? Then I'd have to come up with a top ten list of 'things' that I think contribute to making a good photo.

#### 1. Being there.

You must have heard the term 'f8 and be there'? Well, it's the essence of a good photo. Being in the right place at the right time, or in the case of landscape photography, recognising a good composition, and being submerged in beautiful light

#### 2. Recognising the moment.

Knowing that right here, right now, the light and the subject matter are combining to provide something you feel inspired to capture.

### **3.** Being open to 'anything can happen'.

Often I've found photographers so intent on making an image, and rooted to the spot, that they can't see the wood for the trees. If they only let themselves 'go' and disengage from the process of making a picture, perhaps they will



see aspects they didn't notice, or will research / roam the location they are in. I remember on one workshop taking a picture of some horses below the Cuernos in Torres del Paine. The composition was so obvious to me, yet a participant of my trip said to me afterwards 'I didn't see it'. And I'm sure it's because they were so wrapped up in capturing what they were trying to 'make work' that they missed what was being offered to them.

### 4. Being able to recognise a good composition.

Some people instinctively know when a composition works and just go to it like a duck to water. Others have to experiment over time to discover what lenses work and what sort of compositions work too. Nothing is cast in stone and each person has their own 'vision'. Some are more focused / tuned than others.

### 5. Knowing that what you want to capture will fit onto your film or sensor.

With experience, certain exposures work more than others. Soft light works best than midday light, but having experience can help you determine what will work. I guess this is now getting into the technical realm.

## 6. We're now into the technical realms of photo making.

But have you noticed that I've not even mentioned a camera yet? That's because the camera is purely a tool that YOU direct. I've taken pictures on a crappy 35mm camera that have been better than images I've taken on Large Format. Seven is about exposure. Understanding dynamic range and how to correctly expose the shot to get what you 'see'.

### 7. Which is important? Freezing time, or depth of field?

Often I find with landscape I want to take long exposures when something is moving fast in the scene. I like to convey movement and the passing of time, but sometimes it's not appropriate. Knowing when and how.







#### 8. A camera.

Yes, it does matter, but not as much as the other aspects I've described. Naturally, it's an over-simplification to say a camera doesn't matter, but the point is that it is not the most important element in taking a good picture. It is just a tool and some tools are better than others. Some can hinder than aid, and I've found that some cheaper tools hinder less than some expensive tools. I like a camera which doesn't get in the way. It should be simple to use, and act as an aid or interface between what you see and what you capture. If you're spending too much time fiddling with it, then it's a hindrance, not an aid to capturing the moment.

#### 9. I can't think of any more.

So you see. It's not about the camera. But you do need a camera to capture your 'vision'. Those that say the camera does matter are missing the point. The camera is the last step. It is something you use to record everything else that came before - being there, recognising a moment, understanding light and composition and determining the right exposure. Only then do you reach for your camera.





# Club Subjects

Competition nights are held the third Tuesday of each month. The subjects for the monthly competitions have been set by the Committee and are as follows: Please pay careful attention to the definitions.

#### JUNE Train Study:

A picture of one or more trains, or of appropriate scenes taken near the permanent way of a railway. Model trains are excluded.

#### JULY

#### Against the Light:

Is an image in which the main source of illumination comes from behind the subject as opposed to the front or sides. Such lighting does not preclude the use of other secondary light sources from the camera-side of the subject.

#### AUGUST

Landscape: (The Grace Munday)

An image of any scape taken at twilight either morning or evening.

#### SEPTEMBER

**Book or Film Title:** 

Illustrating the title of a published book or commercially released film. It is thought that a well-known title would have more appeal than an obscure one. To assist in the judging, titles would have to be announced.

#### OCTOBER

#### Action:

An image depicting a person or people doing something in a non-leisurely manner e.g. sport, an emergency, at play or at work.

#### NOVEMBER

#### City at Night:

A scene out-of-doors in a large town or city taken at night. It may consist of illuminations, buildings or people, but there must be evidence to show that the location conforms to the title. A picture of a neon sign with no surrounding detail would not be acceptable.

# Competition Rules

See the club website for the full competition rules and responsibilities. In summary: All financial members of the club are eligible to enter monthly competitions to a maximum of one entry in each of the four competitions (print and digital sections, comprising open and set subject, in either colour or monochrome). All images must be the original photographic work of the member, but may be digitally enhanced.

When entering the next competition remember that Gold and Silver award images may not be re-submitted in either digital or print format at another monthly competition. Similarly, images that come very close to resembling a previous Gold or Silver award entry are ineligible for entry in any section. Bronze and other entries may be converted to a higher standard based upon the judge's comments and only re-submitted in one subsequent competition.

**Digital Images:** Maximum digital image size is 1920(width) x 1080(height) pixels. A different ratio may be applied to the digital image (e.g. square or 'letterbox'), provided the maximum sizes are not exceeded. There is no limit on resolution.

Each digital image must be submitted as a JPEG file (\*.jpg) and in sRGB profile and must have the following file title format: Digital Image Title\_Open / Subject\_Competitor Number.jpg e.g. Snowflakes\_Open / Subject\_151.jpg. Digital images are to be submitted to the Digital Images Coordinator by emailing them to fremantlecameraclub@gmail. com by 12 noon on the Sunday nine days prior to competition night. Prints: Maximum print size is 40 x 50cms, including matt and backing. There is no minimum size. Maximum thickness of entry is 5mm, including print, matt and backing. Any print that does not fit within these maximum sizes may not be accepted for competition. Prints may be produced either commercially (i.e. a printing service) or by the member. Print entries must be properly secured to an appropriate backing of either cardboard or foam core. Members must not submit prints that may potentially damage other entries when packed or during transport. Each print must be labelled with the following format: Image Title; Open / Subject; and Competitor Name and number (ie not just number) e.g. Raindrops; Open / Subject; John Smith 203, on the reverse side of the print in the top left hand corner of the mount board. This makes it easier to return prints. Prints must be delivered to the Print Competition table at Club meetings no later than 7:15pm. The prints are to be placed facedown in the relevant competition area ie Subject or Open.

Points will be allocated in the monthly competition on the following basis:

- a. Gold 5 points;
- b. Silver 3 points;c. Bronze 2 points; and
- d. Non-winning entry 1 point
